



Mark your calendar! The Milwaukee National Weather Service will be offering Storm Spotter Training at the Dodge County Administrative Building (in the auditorium on the 1st floor) on Monday April 21 from 6:30-8:30.

Pre-registration is not necessary to attend these sessions, just show up! Some additional online training sessions may be offered later in the season.

The training sessions will be about 2 hours long each. We will cover safety aspects for spotters/general public along with the essentials of what you need to know to report severe weather to the NWS. Each session will cover the same information, so you only need to attend one. For those that cannot attend any of the live training sessions, we will also record the training and share that in mid May.

Lunch With A Ham Radio Legend: Ned AA7A

While I was out in Arizona the last couple of weeks, I had an unexpected treat. Brian, W7JET, my Summits On The Air "Elmer", invited his good friend Ned, AA7A, to join us for lunch while we were up in Show Low. Ned is a retired Electrical Engineer. AA7A is not a vanity call. It's his FCC issued Extra class call sign.

Ned is quite the ham radio legend. Here are some of his highlights:

- He has 270 countries confirmed on 160 meters!
- He has earned his DXCC (confirmation of 100 countries worked) on every band from 2 meters to 160 meters! "On 2 meters?" you ask. Yes sir! Using EME (bouncing his 2 meter signal off the surface of the moon) to work other hams.
- He has contacted over 1,250 stations in 160 countries on EME using a homebrew antenna system, preamp, and power amplifier. He has also operated EME while portable in West Africa using the calls TZ6NS and 3X5A and in the Bahamas as C6ANS in 2015 and 6Y5AZ in 2016.
- He has been on 30+ DXpeditions including South Sandwich Island (VP8STI) and South Georgia Island (VP8SGI.
- He is top of the Honor Roll Mixed and Phone with 357 countries confirmed.
- He is closing in on the 3,000 level on the DXCC Challenge Award
- Ned is also the ARRL Southwestern Division Vice Director.

One last accomplishment. Ned AA7A (and Brian W7JET) are both part of the Milt Jensen Memorial Station which is located in Safford, Arizona. The station is used by NA7TB, AA7A, KY7M, NA2U, N7NR, K9DR and W7JET for contests and DXing. This is one MEGA remote station which has the following antennas:

- 8-Circle of full-sized 160m quarter wave verticals over an extensive radial field plus 8 bi-directional
 Beverage receive antennas. This is probably the largest 160 meter array in North America
- Full-sized 80m 4-Square antenna which is extremely effective across the entire 75/80m band and also loads perfectly on 60m
- Dual band 30/40m 4-Square
- M2 KT36XA triband Yagi (10, 15, 20 meters) @66'
- Cushcraft 40-2CD 40m Yagi @80'
- InnoVAntennas 8 el OP-DES 6m Yagi @73'
- Force 12 Dual Band 12/17m Yagi @35'
- JK MidTri tri-band Yagi (10, 15, 20 meters) @25'

Here's a more detailed breakdown:

A significant part of a hamfest is a flea market where attendees can buy, sell, and trade a wide variety of amateur radio equipment, from vintage to modern, and related accessories.


