2025 NWS Storm Spotter Training Presentation

Mark your calendar! The Milwaukee National Weather Service will be offering Storm Spotter Training at the Dodge County Administrative Building (in the auditorium on the 1st floor) on Monday April 21 from 6:30-8:30.

Pre-registration is not necessary to attend these sessions, just show up! Some additional online training sessions may be offered later in the season.

The training sessions will be about 2 hours long each. We will cover safety aspects for spotters/general public along with the essentials of what you need to know to report severe weather to the NWS. Each session will cover the same information, so you only need to attend one. For those that can not attend any of the live training sessions, we will also record the training and share that in mid May.

MINI DX-PEDITION IN THE MALDIVES

As many of you know, Diane and I were in The Maldives on a scuba diving trip for the past 2½ weeks. The Maldives does not have the infrastructure to test Maldivians for ham radio licenses. That means the only ham radio operators there have a valid license from other countries, such as myself. With a US extra class license there are quite a number of countries in the world that offer US reciprocity, which means I can operate in any of these countries without any paperwork or fee. In Bonaire, for example, I am PJ4/KA9JDE. In The Maldives it took a little more effort. I had to fill out a form telling their version of the FCC what frequencies I planned on operating on, what modes, rig info, output power etc. I also had to send them my passport and an original copy of my US license. The process took about 2 days and cost me \$13. They issued me the Maldivian call 8Q7BG. Woohoo!



So where in the heck are The Maldives? As the crow flies, the country is 9,200 miles from Wisconsin. It is made up of 1,192 islands of which 187 are inhabited. It is 541 miles from north to south. About 500,000 people live in this unique country. The Maldives are the world's lowest-lying country. By 2050, 80% of the country could become uninhabitable due to global warming and the oceans rising. The northernmost island is about 470 miles southwest of India and Sri Lanka. The southernmost island is below the equator.

For my mini DXpedition, I took my Icom IC-705 transceiver running 10m watts into a home brew linked dipole for 10m / 20m / 40m. Due to high noise issues (probably due to the generator running 24/7 on the boat), I was only

able to work FT8. Happily, I made 33 QSOs in 19 countries! They were Australia, Belarus, Bulgaria, China, Croatia, England, Germany, Greece, Indonesia, Israel, Italy, Japan, New Zealand, Poland, Russia, South Africa, Spain, USA and Ukraine. The US contact was in New York. I used both 10m and 20m. Sadly, I wasn't able to work more hams in the US.


