





Enthusiasts will gather to track down hidden transmitters, known as "foxes," using their radio direction-finding skills. This event is a great opportunity for members to test their abilities, enjoy the camaraderie of fellow radio enthusiasts, and experience the thrill of the chase in the beautiful surroundings of Dodge County. Whether you're a seasoned hunter or a newcomer, the Spring Fox Hunt is sure to be an unforgettable experience. All are welcome to participate. The actual location in Dodge County is still undetermined. General location will be provided once decided upon.

For anyone not familiar with fox hunts:

In ham radio, a fox hunt is a fun activity where amateur radio operators locate a hidden radio transmitter (the "fox") using direction-finding techniques. It's essentially a radio-based game of hide-and-seek, often combining outdoor activities with the hobby. You don't have to be a seasoned ham radio operator to participate. Feel free to show up at the event and we get you placed with one of the groups of vehicles that are participating!

What's the purpose of a fox hunt:

The Fox Hunt is an informal hunt held on irregular intervals for the enjoyment of the participants, and to train amateur radio operators to learn, refine, and use direction finding skills. These hunts are a fun activity, and everyone is invited to participate. However, they are preparation for serious business. Direction finding skills would be necessary for the following situations:

- Locating a downed aircraft
- Locating either a technological or human signal source which is interfering with a radio system.
- Locating lost or injured people. This would include hikers, hams during emergencies, public service employees and others that may have a transmitter.

Every June, more than 40,000 hams throughout North America set up temporary transmitting stations in public places to demonstrate ham radio's science, skill and service to our communities and our nation.


It combines public service, emergency preparedness, community outreach, and technical skills all in a single event.



What is ARRL Field Day? You're Invited!

ARRL Field Day is a radio communications event that brings together amateur radio operators (also called "hams") within your community. The theme for 2025 Field Day is "Radio Connects" – highlighting the many ways that wireless technology connects people across distances near and far. The event is part picnic, campout, practice for emergencies, informal contest, and most of all, fun! ARRL Field Day is the most popular ham radio activity held annually in the US and Canada. On the fourth weekend in June each year, more than 31,000 hams get together with their radio clubs, schools, or friends to operate from remote locations.

For many radio clubs, ARRL Field Day is one of the highlights on their annual calendar. A typical Field Day site will showoff many aspects of amateur radio and its many roles.



Amateur radio also inspires the next generation of technical leaders by providing a hands-on sandbox where students gain experience in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM).

For those with a competitive spirit, Field Day stations compete to make radio contacts with as many other stations as possible while learning to operate radio equipment in challenging situations and less-than-optimal conditions. These same skills are used by hams who volunteer to help with large, preplanned, non-emergency events such as marathons and bike-a-thons; fundraisers such as walk-a-thons; celebrations such as parades, and exhibits at fairs, malls, and museums.

Who is ARRL?

With more than 137,000 members, ARRL is The National Association for Amateur Radio in the US. Our mission is to promote and protect the art, science, and enjoyment of amateur radio, and to develop the next generation of radio amateurs. ARRL and our affiliated radio clubs provide benefits to members to discover radio, to develop new skills, and to serve your local community.

What is Amateur Radio?

Often called "ham radio," the Amateur Radio Service is a worldwide community of licensed operators using the airwaves with every conceivable means of communications technology. It is made up of people who enjoy learning and being able to transmit voice, data, and pictures through the airwaves to places near and far without depending on commercial systems. The amateur radio frequencies are the last remaining place in the usable radio spectrum where an individual can develop and experiment with wireless communications. Not only can hams build and modify their equipment, but they can also create new ways to communicate via the airwaves — and do it as a globally connected community. Many people in the hobby form lifelong friendships with people they wouldn't have otherwise met. Many rock stars, Hollywood actors, and heads of state (and even your neighbor down the street) are ham radio operators. You can be, too! Get started at ARRL Field Day!

A "hamfest" is a gathering, often a weekend event, for amateur radio operators (or "hams") to socialize, buy, sell, and trade amateur radio equipment, participate in forums and seminars, and potentially take amateur radio license exams.

Here's a more detailed breakdown:

Social Event:

Hamfests are primarily social events where hams can connect with each other and share their passion for amateur radio.

Flea Market:

A significant part of a hamfest is a flea market where attendees can buy, sell, and trade a wide variety of amateur radio equipment, from vintage to modern, and related accessories.

Seminars and Forums:

Many hamfests feature seminars and forums covering various aspects of amateur radio, including technical, operational, and legal topics.

License Exams:

Some hamfests also host volunteer examiner teams (VEs) who administer amateur radio license exams.

Commercial Exhibits:

Some hamfests include commercial exhibits where manufacturers and vendors showcase and sell their amateur radio equipment.

Amateur Radio Clubs:

Hamfests can also serve as a venue for meetings of amateur radio clubs.


