
We had an EXCELLENT turnout of "hunters"!



The "fox" (transmitter) in a Jersey Mike's box hidden in a tree above co-fox Cameron KD9VG




The remaining "hunters" found the fox shortly after Max and Michael








First Place: Max KD9NZB and Michael AA9RK

Winlink is a worldwide digital messaging system that lets amateur radio operators send and receive email using our radios.

Messages can travel directly station-to-station or pass through a network of "gateways" that connect to the internet.

- Emergency Communications (EMCOMM): Winlink is one of the most reliable ways to move formal traffic and ICS forms during disasters.
- Remote Operations
   Sailors, adventurers, and
   SOTA/POTA activators use it for weather reports, position tracking, and staying in touch from remote places
- Everyday Practice
   Many ARES/RACS groups hold weekly Winlink nets so operators can stay proficient.

### Why It Matters

Winlink bridges radio and the internet. Whether you're preparing for storm season, helping at a communitty event or just exploring digital modes, Winlink is a powerful tool that belongs in evey hams toolkit.

- ✓ Download Winlink Express (free software)
- ✓ Radio: HF, VHE or UHF with a sound card or TNC interface
- ✓ Practice sending a "check-in" message to a Winlink net.



### WHAT IS A HAMFEST?

A "hamfest" is a gathering, often a weekend event, for amateur radio operators (or "hams") to socialize, buy, sell, and trade amateur radio equipment, participate in forums and seminars, and potentially take amateur radio license exams.

Here's a more detailed breakdown:

Social Event:

Hamfests are primarily social events where hams can connect with each other and share their passion for amateur radio.

Flea Market:

A significant part of a hamfest is a flea market where attendees can buy, sell, and trade a wide variety of amateur radio equipment, from vintage to modern, and related accessories.

Seminars and Forums:

Many hamfests feature seminars and forums covering various aspects of amateur radio, including technical, operational, and legal topics.

License Exams:

Some hamfests also host volunteer examiner teams (VEs) who administer amateur radio license exams.

Commercial Exhibits:

Some hamfests include commercial exhibits where manufacturers and vendors showcase and sell their amateur radio equipment.

Amateur Radio Clubs:

Hamfests can also serve as a venue for meetings of amateur radio clubs.
